THESIS STANDARDS – 2021

(Guidelines for Thesis Writing & Submission)

1. Title and General Rules:

- i. The thesis standards may be called "Vasantrao Naik Marathwada Krishi Vidyapeeth Thesis Standards 2021: Guidelines for Thesis Writing & Submission".
- ii. Thesis should be written strictly according to the revised guidelines.
- iii. These standards shall come into force after its publication on the University Website.
- iv. The rough draft of the thesis should be submitted in two copies for PG and in three copies for Ph.D.
- v. The hard-bound thesis should be submitted in four copies along with CD/DVDs.
- vi. The researcher should give proper citations and acknowledgements in thesis writing to prevent plagiarism.
- vii. These standards may be revised from time to time as per the requirements.

2. General Instructions for Thesis Writing:

- i. Scientific impersonality should be maintained in thesis writing by avoiding the words like I, me, we, us etc.
- ii. The abbreviations and symbols should be avoided in the thesis main text where as they may be used in tables and figure if necessary.
- iii. Every new chapter should begin on new page.
- iv. Borders should not be used around the text.
- v. Acknowledgement should be precise and shall not exceed more than two pages.
- vi. Dedication page is to be optional in the thesis.
- vii. Tables and figures should be placed on the appropriate pages where they mentioned for the first time in the text.
- viii. Only standard abbreviations should be used wherever it necessary.
- ix. Follow APA style (American Psychological Association) for quoting references.
- x. Source of information should be mentioned below the table / figure whenever it is necessary.
- xi. Unnecessary photographs / sketches should be avoided.

3. Typographical Details:

i. Paper & Printing: White Executive Bond Paper of A-4 size and minimum weight 85 GSM should be used for thesis printing. Thesis should be printed back to back from Chapter-I to last page. Preliminary pages should be printed on single and separate pages.

ii. Font: Times New Roman font should be used for typing of complete thesis.

iii. Font Size & Alignment:

Chapter Number: 14 point bold (All CAPS) with left alignment (In Roman)

Chapter Heading / Title: 16 point bold (All CAPS) with central alignment

Heading within chapter : 12 point bold with left alignment

Body or Text : 12 point normal with justify alignment

iv. Numbering of Divisions: The heading within chapters should be apply multilevel style numbering. The heading should be numbered continuously in Arabic numerals by prefixing chapter number in which they appear.

e.g. The first heading appearing in the Chapter –I should be numbered as

1.1 Objectives

1.2 Limitations of the study (For Sub heading, use 1.1.1, 1.1.2 if necessary)

v. Margins: The page margins should be as per following specifications Printing of thesis should double sided (back to back printing), margins need to be mirrored for left and right.

Left margin for front page	1.5 inch	Right margin for back page	1.5 inch
Right margin for front page	1.0 inch	Left margin for back page	1.0 inch
Top margin for both pages	1.0 inch	Bottom margin for both pages	1.0 inch

- vi. Line Spacing There should be line spacing of 1.5.
- **vii. Tables:** The title of the table should be placed at top of the table with table number in the bold font. The table should be numbered continuously in Arabic numerals by prefixing chapter number in which they appear. The table number should be ended with full colon (:) and followed by the title of the table
 - e.g. The first table appearing in the Chapter –III should be numbered as;

Table 3.1: Classification of the plant diseases

viii. Figure / Plate: The title of figure / plate should be placed at the bottom of the figure / plate with figure / plate number in the bold letters. The figure / plate should be numbered continuously in Arabic numerals by prefixing chapter number in which they appear. The figure / plate number should be ended with full colon (:) and followed by the name of figure / plate

e.g. The first figure appearing in the Chapter – IV should be numbered as;

Fig. 4.1: Indian population increased in the last decade

The first plate appearing in the Chapter –IV should be numbered as;

Plate 4.1: Sugar beet tubers

ix. Thesis Abstract: It shall be written as THESIS ABSTRACT in capital bold letters and central alignment. The abstract shall be preceded by the name of the candidate (research student), title, degree to which it is submitted and the particulars of faculty, department, research guide, university and year of submission. The abstract shall be condensed but informative covering the essential points of the investigation. It shall include the nature and scope of the research undertaken, brief methodology, conclusions and contribution made to the knowledge of the subject treated. At least five keywords should be written at the end of Thesis Abstract in bracket. (Format attached pp-22)

x. Pagination & Numbering:

- The Page numbers should be given at the bottom of page with center alignment in Arabic Numerals.
- The preliminary pages before Chapter-I should be numbered with Roman Numerals (i.e. I, II, III etc.).
- The pages starting from Chapter-I to Appendices should be numbered continuously in Arabic Numerals (i.e. 1, 2, 3).
- **xi. Photographs**: Art/photo paper should be used for printing the photographs.
- **xii. Symbols & Abbreviations:** The International standards of symbols and abbreviations should be followed.
- **xiii. Separators between Chapters:** Separators should be used in the thesis. The separator should contain only Chapter Number and Title of the Chapter at the center of page in the bold and capitals Times New Roman and font size of 20. No decoration / designs should be made on separators. White Executive Bond Paper of A-4 size and minimum weight 85 GSM should be used for separators. Use of transparencies, designs, ornamental papers etc. should be avoided.



xiv. Borders around the text: Borders should not be used in entire thesis.

4. Binding:

- Use perfect and hard bound binding for the thesis.
- The color of binding rexine should be black.
- The details of thesis / title page content should be embossed on thesis or computerized print with golden color is also allowed with lamination.
- The spine of thesis should contain initial name of the researcher at the centre, degree title at left alignment and year of submission in right alignment in golden embossing or computerized printing in golden color with minimum 20 point bold letter.

The final print of the thesis should be arranged as per the following sequence;



- All references and sources cited in all chapters from Introduction to Summary and Conclusion should be included in the Literature Cited of the thesis.

- In parenthetical citations, the author name and publication date appear in parentheses.
- In narrative citations, the author name is incorporated into the text as part of the sentence and the year follows in parentheses.

Parenthetical Citations

Both the author and the year, separated by a comma, appear in parentheses for a parenthetical citation. A parenthetical citation can appear within or at the end of a sentence.

It has been noted that the majority of respondents (65.00%) had high utility perception of AgroTech VNMKV mobile app (Pawar, 2019).

Narrative Citations

The author's surname appears in running text, and the year appears in parentheses immediately after the author's name for a narrative citation. The author's name can be included in the sentence in any place it makes sense.



Penalties in case of plagiarism in submission of thesis and dissertations

(As per VNMKV Anti Plagiarism Policy passed by the Academic Council on Date: 16.12.2019)

The University has decided the penalties for plagiarism in the thesis according to the level of plagiarism. The penalties shall be imposed by the Institutional Academic Integrity Panel (IAIP) according to the severity of plagiarism. The penalties are decided as per the UGC-Regulations: 2018 (*Promotion of Academic Integrity and Prevention of Plagiarism*) / ICAR as follows –

S.N	Level	Description	Penalty
i	0	Similarities up to 10%	No Penalty
ii	1	Similarities above 10% to 40%	Such student shall be asked to submit a revised script within a stipulated time period not exceeding 6 months
iii	2	Similarities above 40% to 60%	Such student shall be debarred from submitting a revised script for a period of one year.
iv	3	Similarities above 60%	Such student registration for that program shall be cancelled.

Note 1: Penalty on repeated plagiarism: Such student shall be punished for the plagiarism for one level higher than the previous level committed by him/her. In case where plagiarism of highest level is committed then the punishment for the same shall be operative.

Note 2 : Penalty in case where the degree/ credit has already been obtained : If plagiarism is proved on a date later than the date of award of degree or credit as the case may be then his/her degree or credit shall be put in abeyance for a period recommended by IAIP and approved by the Hon. Vice Chancellor.


